








PARCC ELA FINDINGS: 2017

- Overall student achievement in English Language Arts increased.
- Increase in the percent of students meeting and exceeding expectations in all tested grades (3-11), ranging from 26% to 111%.

PARCC MATH FINDINGS: 2017

- Overall student achievement in Mathematics increased in grades 3, 4, 6, Algebra 1, and Algebra 2.

- Increase in the percent of students meeting and exceeding expectations ranges from 9% to 120%.




MATH GRADES 3-11 STUDENTS MEETING/EXCEEDING




HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION



PASSAIC HIGH SCHOOL 4-YEAR GRADUATION RATE




PASSAIC HIGH SCHOOL NUMBER OF 4-YEAR GRADUATES




PASSAIC HIGH SCHOOL TOTAL AP COURSE ENROLLMENT




PASSAIC HIGH SCHOOL TOTAL AP EXAMS





PASSAIC HIGH SCHOOL ADVANCED PLACEMENT PARTICIPATION




Total Scores of 3, 4, or 5




PASSAIC HIGH SCHOOL SAT PARTICIPATION




DUAL ENROLLMENT




