

















ELA GRADES 3-11 STUDENTS MEETING/EXCEEDING




MATH GRADES 3-11 STUDENTS MEETING/EXCEEDING







TOTAL ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSE ENROLLMENT

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PARTICIPATION




Total Scores of 3, 4, or 5

Students Tested




ADVANCED PLACEMENT SCHOLARS



Students who have achieved the distinction of receiving a 3, 4, or 5 on 3 or more exams.




SAT PARTICIPATION




DUAL ENROLLMENT
