Thirty-six (36) students are expected to graduate from the class of 2025 with a high school diploma and an Associate's Degree!














DUAL ENROLLMENT

The Passaic County Executive Superintendent and County School Business Official approved the submission of the District's budget on March 20, 2025.








EXPENDITURES



Report on the Financial Statements

Opinions

We have audited the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities and each major fund of the Passie Public Schools as of and for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2024 and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Board of Education's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, the business-type activities and each major fund of the Pasaic Public Schools as of June 30, 2024, and the respective changes in financial position and, where applicable, eash flows thereof for the fiscal year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinions

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, the standards applicable to financial audits contained in <u>Government Auditing</u> Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States and the audit requirements preseribed by the Office of School Finance, Department of Education, State of New Jersey. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Passio Public Schools and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in a croadrance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit.


